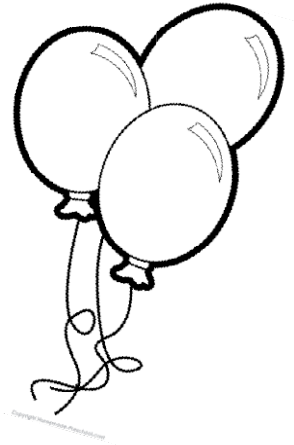

The Society also provides scholarships of \$1,000 each to a deserving student from Bristol County Agricultural School and Norfolk County Agricultural School.

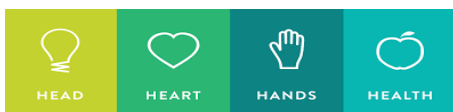

In 2001, long-time Marshfield Fair Director John LaForest passed away. After retiring, John became an avid bird carver who produced over 100 carvings, giving many as gifts and donating many to charity auctions. Those who are lucky to have one of John's carvings realize they own something special. For many years John also exhibited his carvings at the Fair and demonstrated carving in the exhibit hall. It was always John's wish to develop a larger bird carving presence at the Marshfield Fair. In his honor, in 2002 Marshfield Fair initiated the John LaForest Bird Carving Contest. It is now held the last Saturday of the Fair every year.

EXHIBITOR'S RULES & REGULATIONS

- In cooperation with the Massachusetts Department of Food and Agriculture, this year's fair is to be held August 16-25, 2024, inclusive at the Marshfield Fairgrounds.
- Premiums and gratuities in all departments of the Fair are open to all exhibitors.
- No discount is made for non-membership.
- Entries must be made only on designated dates and times. See list of entry dates and times on page 7.
- Premium lists, programs, posters, or any information regarding the Fair will be provided upon request to Carleton E. Chandler, Secretary. Please call 781-834-6629 or visit our website at www.marshfieldfair.org.
- No exhibits, games or concessions which violate the rules of the Society or the laws of the Commonwealth will be allowed on the grounds.

SOCIETY REGULATIONS - FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Exhibitors are requested to use the South River Street gate, leading directly to the Agricultural Hall.
2. **Absolutely no entry will be received in any department after the day and hour designated.**
3. All articles, products, flowers, fruits and vegetables offered for premiums must have been manufactured or produced by the person in whose name they are exhibited on or after August 18, 2023.
4. Awards are made in accordance with entries. Therefore, exhibitors should take care to have stock and articles properly entered.
5. No premiums will be awarded unless entry and required statement have been made according to the rules of the society.
6. In all departments every exhibit should be designated by entry number only, and no names of exhibitors are to be attached until the awards have been made.
7. Description cards will be furnished to exhibitors who are responsible for filling out and properly displaying with their animals or articles/items exhibited.
8. **Only one entry can be made by the same exhibitor in any one class unless noted.**
9. No animal shall be entitled to a premium unless it has been owned by the exhibitor for at least the required minimum amount of time as stated in the Animal General Rules.
10. The best animal will receive a premium, even though it has taken a premium at a previous fair.
11. Premiums will be payable by the treasurer within ten days after the award. If a competitor is dissatisfied with the awards of the committee, a protest shall be made to the secretary in writing, no later than the day following the awards and the matter may be

adjusted by the directors. Any questions regarding premiums paid must be filed with the Marshfield Fair office before December 1st of the year issued.

12. **The Society uses every reasonable means to protect all property on exhibit but will not be responsible for loss from any cause.**
13. The exhibitor agrees to be solely responsible for any loss or injury to or damage done, occasioned by, or arising from, any animals on exhibit and to defend and to indemnify the Fair and the Management thereof against all claims and liability in regard thereto, and upon these conditions only will entries be accepted. In view of the indemnity agreement appearing on Entry Forms and herein, exhibitors may find it advisable for their own protection to carry liability insurance, if not already covered.
14. To enter a 4-H division, the youth must be a currently enrolled 4-H member in good standing.
15. No supervisor or judge may enter a competitive contest.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

1. All classes are open to anyone.
Entry fee \$1.00 per person.
2. Groups are judged separately (see entry form).
3. Only one entry per class number.
MAXIMUM 10 ITEMS PER EXHIBITOR
4. Entries must be made by the exhibitor between August 2023 – August 2024.
5. Entries should be finished, clean and unused.
6. No item may exceed 3 feet in any direction.
7. **JUDGING:** Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of qualified judges. Fine quality, artistic coloring, and design will be considered in the judging. No exhibit will be entitled to an award unless it possesses points of superiority. Judges reserve the right to make new classes.
8. Articles will be refused if previously entered or if there is a lack of display space.
9. Articles on exhibit may not be sold during the Fair.
10. Articles must remain on exhibit until removal day.
11. The Fair takes thorough security precautions but is not responsible for articles entered or not picked up on removal day nor for damage to items. If you cannot remove your exhibits on Tuesday, ask a friend to or make arrangements with the committee. If you have also entered flowers or vegetables, pickup all items on Tuesday, Aug. 27, 2-6 p.m.

4. Attach a string tag to each article. One side, put name, address. The other, the size & price of the article, shop code and the number of the article as listed on the entry form.

5. New consignors will be given a shop code on entry day.
6. No markdowns allowed. No exchanges. No refunds.
7. No orders taken. Business cards may be displayed.
8. No articles will be accepted after entry day.
9. Checks will be distributed on removal day.
10. All consignment is at the owner's risk.
11. All articles must be made by the exhibitor.
12. The Craft Shop cannot sell items for human consumption.

Method: Using 100% cotton, make a traditional pattern, appliqué, or an original design.

Size: Block should be 12 1/2" unfinished.

The 2024 theme will be *Birds of Massachusetts*.

For this contest "Birds of Massachusetts" is defined ONLY as those birds listed on the Massachusetts Audubon Daily Field Card. For copies of this list or to verify a bird's listing contact either Kevin Dunn or John Schreiber.

- **Novice Class**- Carvers who have been carving for 1-5 years and not won a 1st in the Novice division.
- **Intermediate Class**- Carvers who have been carving for more than 5 years and not won a 1st in this division.
- **Open Class**- all amateur and professional carvers. It is also open to Novice and Intermediate carvers.
- **Bench Class**- Carvers whose birds do not fit into any of the above classes or who brought extra birds.

Entry Fees:

Entry fee will include admission to the Marshfield Fair

Novice & Intermediate Classes - \$5 for 1st entry, \$5 addtl.

Open Class - \$10 for the 1st entry, \$5 for additional entries

Bench - \$10 per entry

Contestants may enter up to **TWO** birds in each category.

Realistic (decorative) Life-size

Realistic (decorative) Miniature – Miniatures are one half or less life-size but no larger than 8 inches.

Decoy/Stickups - "Decoy/stickups" are working or hunting decoys of wildfowl or shorebirds both antique and contemporary.

Bench - interpretive bird carvings or do not fit in the other 3 categories. Open to all classes
